	At the recent CC Chancellor's retreat, VP Morton shared about the		
	Hawaii Promise Program, and that a bill is being proposed towards		
	providing funding for "unmet" needs of students. The bill would target		
	historically underserved, first generation students and will be voted on		
	at their next meeting.		
	Other ongoing initiatives include getting a consultant to look at three		
	previous studies about where the Manono Campus could be and inform		
	the campus on available data. Administrators continue to work on		
	strategic planning and determining institutional priorities for this year.		
	One focus is on diversifying resources including creation of an "Invest in		
	the Future Fund." Priorities include: 1) solidify the international		
	program, 2) obtain a grant writer or coordinator that could work with		
	the college to help build capacity, 3) community partnerships and		
	fundraising (we have the lowest contribution of all the campuses);		
	Andrea Christensen was hired as a UH Foundation employee for		
	fundraising and admin is working with her to build momentum and		
	partnerships, 4) focus on fostering relationships within our kauhale.		
	Senators were asked to share what they want from Administration		
	reports. It was asked that Andrea Christensen be brought to the Senate		
	floor for an official introduction. Chancellor Solemsaas agreed. Email the		
	Chancellor with any further suggestions.

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4. Chair's Report Ch	hair Giordanengo reported: 1) Manoa is having discussions in their Senate to completely remove course student evaluations (currently eCAFE; slated to become CSE). They did not say if they would have a replacement. It's unclear what UH System thinks about this. Our FPC committee should keep working on it but be aware that this is happening. 2) Manoa proposing to split the BOR. Three separate scenarios have been proposed: 1) split into three separate BOR (one for CC, one for Manoa, one for West Oahu/UHH). Question: What about Maui? They would likely be with the CC BOR; 2) one BOR, with a return to having Provosts. In this scenario there would be three Provosts - one for Manoa and West Oahu; one for CCs on Oahu, Maui, and Kauai; and one for UHH/HawCC. This would require a statewide vote to amend the constitution; 3) No changes. 3) Chairs of committees were asked to please ensure that members of committees take information back to departments prior to bringing to Senate and make any necessary changes before then, so that only major amendments should be brought to Senate. Concerns can be emailed to the Chair. a. Discussion ensued. If items are brought to Senate and major discussion takes place, items can be tabled, sent back to committee, or time limits through Robert's Rules can be set for debate. In committees where not all departments are represented, major items should be sent to Department Chairs so that the departments can inform their constituents. The Chair will also send out an FYI to the broader community in the latter case.

f. Proposed Changes to RP 9.214: Teaching Assignments for Instructional Faculty Attachment 5	Regent policy to make teaching assignments of instructional Faculty available to the public online. Discussion ensued. Unsure if this is a transparency effort, possibly related to reassign time, or could have to do with research activities at four-year colleges more than CCs. Public posting could be discriminatory, and reasonably should be non-instructional faculty too. It was noted that Faculty members are not all instructional faculty. One advantage could be that students might want to see curriculum vitae of faculty members, but this is not necessarily related to TE. It was also suggested to take what was in our catalog in terms of required TE by Department and put this online. The Chair asks that further comments to be emailed or put on paper and placed in his mailbox before September 30 to be shared with the BOR. Comments will be shared anonymously, coming from the Chair and full Academic Senate. BOR will discuss at their next meeting.
